Draft Purpose and Need - Advocate for:

- **Center data on humans, not vehicles**: Prioritize data and safety for people on foot, on bikes, on transit.
- **Prioritize Health and Environment:** Address ongoing environmental injustices, including health, housing, and economic inequities.
- **Prioritize Connectivity**: Improve neighborhood connections across the corridor.

Draft Selection Criteria Memo - Advocate for:

- Work at the human-scale: Person miles traveled is multi-modal, not just vehicle-centered.
- Maintain and improve quality of life: For adjacent neighborhoods, and reduce and minimize noise and air pollution and disproportionate environmental justice impacts.

Draft System Performance Memo - Advocate for:

• Build toward our common future: Incorporate the 2040 Land Use Plan & Fairview Neighborhood Plan visions for the Fairview Greenway, lane reductions, Gamble main street, and more. Create a vibrant urban mixed-use corridor to revitalize Fairview.
